Batchelor's cup scoop

Mike Batchelor of West London won a closefought CTC Tourist Competition for the second time in 2009, making it two victories in a row for him. Points are awarded in this event for completing touring events across the country, with up to 12 events counting.

Batchelor had a season-long struggle with Mark Beauchamp of North Hampshire, who had placed second and third in previous years, and the victory was decided by the competition's tie-break rule. In third and fourth place were Lee Jackson (Nottingham) and Bernard Hammond (Bristol), both of whom were new to

the event this year.

Shaun Gregory (North Lancs) was the Junior (boy) champion, while Heather Jones – one of our youngest competitors to date at just 10 years of age – was bestplaced Junior (girl) after completing nine events. She also topped the junior list outright.

The Winner of the EF Butterworth (1st Lady) & Craven Vase (1st Lady Veteran) was Sue Ingold, who added her name to those of many other South Bucks riders on these trophies. Sue first won these two cups in 2007, when South Bucks also won the team event.

This year the team event was won by Chester and North Wales, as it was the previous year. This is the fifth time they have won the team award, almost equalling West Surrey's tally of six wins. Chester and North Wales' riders were Andy Polakowski, Lowri Evans, David Statham, Ifor Jones, Graham Payne and Vicky Payne. And finally, the award for the best placed male Scottish rider went to Ron Harrow of Tayside.

I'd like to thank again Mark Draper for the vital work he puts in maintaining the event website, and am pleased to report that Mark was awarded a CTC Certificate of Merit in 2009 in recognition of his work with the CTC Tourist Competition and with Chester & North Wales CTC.

To enter the 2010 CTC Tourist Competition you need only take part in a number of counting events, which are listed in Cycle magazine each issue. 
CTC BIRTHDAY RIDES GO WEST

This year's Birthday Rides, the week-long cycling celebration of CTC's founding, will take place near Falmouth in Cornwall from 19th-25th August. There will be 10-20 mile rides each day for families plus rides of up to 80 miles for experienced cyclists, all weaving through beautiful Cornish countryside, as well as social events and sightseeing. And there's a 10% discount for bookings made by 10th April.

You can choose between half-board or self-catering accommodation in three-star en suite flats at the Combined Universities of Cornwall, or camp nearby at Penryn. Rides are selfled, so you can choose when to leave and who to ride with, and have detailed route sheets. Events laid on include a trip over the River Fal, a coach trip to the Eden Project, evening films, a hog roast, and the annual Birthday Tea, which will be at Pendennis Castle. There will also be three audax events of 200, 100 and (for families) 50km.

The Birthday Rides were first held in 1970, when CTC decided to run a week-long cycling holiday as a build up to the CTC Centenary in 1978. The event moves around the country each year and is an excellent opportunity to explore the favourite rides, scenery and tea stops of a CTC group from another part of the country.
